ASSESSMENT AND CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES

Successful Kids

This program coordinates access to mental health services and supports based on a child's individual needs and the needs of the family. The goal is to keep children in their homes, schools and communities.

Funded by: Central Florida Behavioral Health Network, Children's Network of Hillsborough, and Medicaid Youth/Families served in 2023: 281

Services Provided: Information and Referral, Assessment, Case Management and Behavioral Health Services

Successful Students

This program targets students who are identified as needing behavioral health intervention either due to truancy issues or through the Hillsborough County Schools' mental health plan. **Funded by:** Central Florida Behavioral Health Network and Hillsborough County Public Schools

Youth/Families served in 2023: 126

Services Provided: Assessment, Triage, Case Management, Service Brokering, Crisis Stabilization, Family Support Planning

Successful Parents (TANF)

This program provides services to parents who are struggling with mental illness. Professional case managers coordinate care with a focus on family and economic stability.

Funded by: Central Florida Behavioral Health Network and the Spurlino Foundation

Parents served in 2023: 22

Services Provided: Assessment, Case Management, Therapy, Service Brokering, Family Support Planning

Healthy Transitions

Serving young adults 16 to 25 years old struggling with mental health issues, this program strives to make mental health support services more readily available to youth through individualized and group wellness activities.

Services Provided: Assessment, Case Management, Service Brokering, Support Groups, Educational/Vocational Assistance and Social Activities

SPECIALTY PROGRAMS

Successful Families

This program serves children and families surrounding the East and South Children's Board Family Resource Centers through bilingual, culturally competent, community-based services including Intensive Care Coordination (Wraparound), Natural Helpers (Promotoras), parenting classes, support and counseling.

Healthy Minds

This innovative program is designed for youth and young adults with unusual thoughts or behaviors, and those who have started hearing or seeing things that others don't. Healthy Minds helps people achieve their goals for school, work and relationships.

Peer Services

Youth Experiencing Success (YES)

This program provides family navigation and in-home therapy services to youth and families in the Juvenile Mental Health Court. It is designed to help them through the judicial process, link them to mental health services, and reduce the risk that they will violate laws in the future.

Funded by: Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners through a Department of Children and Families grant

Individuals served in 2023: 57

Services Provided: Assessment, Family Support Planning, Family Navigation and In-Home Therapy

Healthy Start

Healthy Start is a home visitation program that provides education and care coordination to pregnant women and families with children under the age of three. The goal of the program is to lower risk factors associated with preterm birth, low birth weight, infant mortality, and poor developmental outcomes. Healthy Start provides mothers, newborns and families with the resources, support and help they need to develop a healthy pregnancy and a healthy birth.

Funded by: Healthy Start Coalition of Hillsborough County Pregnant women and infants served in 2023: 14,280 Services Provided: Parenting and Childbirth Education. Psychological Counseling, Inter-Conceptional Care Education, Smoking Cessation, Nutritional Education, Developmental Screening and Care Coordination

Inspiring the Next Group of Helpers

Jennifer McLeish has been a Healthy Start case manager since 2015. Over the past nine years she has provided services to hundreds of women and infant children, and in 2022 she met two special mothers, Alexis Jacobson and Shara Young.

When Jennifer met Alexis and Shara, she guickly learned what amazing women they were. Both had backgrounds in social services, and she recognized that they had many of the qualities that make Healthy Start case managers successful.

For Alexis, Jennifer had come into her life at a pivotal time. She was about to have a baby, and she had been laid off from her job and didn't know what was next for her professionally. When Jennifer talked about her role as a case manager, it was clear

she loved her work. Alexis was inspired and found herself thinking about returning to her roots in social services. "I loved the idea of meeting people where they are and offering practical solutions," she said.

Shara was also drawn to Jennifer's enthusiasm for her work. When Jennifer shared that Shara reminded her of herself, she also started to consider becoming a case manager. "I realized that I wanted to help others in the ways that Jennifer had helped me," she said.

Today, Jennifer is thrilled that Alexis and Shara are both thriving Healthy Start case managers with full caseloads. "They both have such a sweet, caring vibe. I'm so happy they are here."






















VISION STATEMENT:
